Update on Marina Response to the

COVID-19 VIRUS

The Port of Bellingham is closely watching the recommendations of the Whatcom County Health Department and the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC) with regards to the COVID-19 virus. On Friday, March 20, 2020

we sent an email notifying our marina customers that the Port had closed all Port offices for all non-essential services until further notice. The closure is consistent with the actions we have all seen across the U.S. The health of our customers and Port staff is paramount.

At this time the harbor offices are closed for walk-in customers however, moorage business can still be conducted by phone or email. The harbor will be operating with minimal staffing in order to maintain essential services such as safety and security. During this health emergency, the harbors will continue to be patrolled after-hours by security.

With the heightened concern regarding the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Port has contracted its janitorial service to complete an additional mid-day sanitation service in all the restrooms, showers, and laundry facilities. This is in addition to the regular nightly cleaning services.

We are asking for your support and assistance in the effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19. When using either the shower or laundry facilities, please wipe down flat surfaces, handles, etc.

with a sanitizing wipe before and after each use. We had hoped to be able to provide wipes

for you, but we have found that all the supply is being directed to the medical field.

The Port encourages everyone to educate themselves on CDC recommendations and adopt Best Management Practices and strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

In addition to frequently washing your hands with soap and water, an important strategy for reducing the spread of COVID-19 is social distancing or limiting the amount of contact you have with others. More information is available at www.coronavirus.wa.gov

National Safe Boating Week promotes awareness for boating safety and education. Some ways to participate include:

Review the Washington State Parks
 Adventures in Boating Handbook, which
 provides general information about safe
 vessel operation and laws. The booklet can
 be viewed free online at: www.boat ed.com/washington/handbook/

 Enroll in a boating safety course. Washington State law requires that vessel operators have satisfied the requirements of the Boater Education Safety Program. Complete an annual vessel safety check.
 Both the USCG and U.S. Power Squadron offer courtesy vessel safety checks. Visit the harbor office for more details.

 Wear a life jacket. Both harbor offices participate in the life jacket loaner program for children. Please return the borrowed lifejackets as soon as possible so they are available for the next boater in need.
