## 30 Day Cancellation of Moorage

Effective March 1, 2023 the moorage cancellation notification has changed from 15 days to 30 days. This will provide staff adequate time to re-assign slips in a timely manner allowing as many community members as possible to have access to the marina. As a reminder, all moorage cancellations must be in writing and can be accepted either at the harbor office or by email. Please feel free to contact the Harbor Office if you have any questions.

## Annual Moorage Due in April

Annual moorage customer will see the renewal on their April moorage statement. Payment must be received before the end of April or your moorage will revert to monthly. The annual moorage discount for 2023 is 5% which is based on the rate of a five-year treasury bill plus 1%. If you have registered for automatic payments and you wish to pay your balance by another means, please let the harbor office know before April 14th to make the change. Also, if you would like to change from monthly to annual moorage, please contact the Harbor Office before April 30th.

National Safe Boating Week May 20-26

National Safe Boating Week promotes awareness for boating safety and education. Some ways to participate include:

- Review the Washington
   State Parks Adventures in Boating
   Handbook HERE.
- Study and pass a state approved Boater Education Safety Program HERE.
- Complete an annual vessel safety check. Both the USCG and U.S. Power Squadron offer courtesy vessel safety checks. Visit the harbor office for more details.
- Wear a life jacket. Both harbor offices participate in the life jacket loaner program for children. Please return the borrowed lifejackets as soon as possible so they are available for the next boater in need.

#### **Electrical Rate Increase**

The marinas individually meter our moorage customers' electrical usage and include the charge with their bi-monthly statement. After an extensive review, staff found that the electrical KwH rates have not adequately kept up with the rates billed by the Port's electrical service providers. The new rates will be reflected on the June 2023 statement which will include the bi-monthly power usage for the months of April and May.

## **Net Mending at the Dockside Market**

If you have considered renting the Fishermen's Pavilion for a spring net repair project, now is your chance!

To help facilitate use of the facility and promote interaction with the public on our working waterfront, an anonymous donor has pre-paid the daily use fee for three commercial fishers to repair nets during the Saturday Dockside Market. The next three fishers who register to use the Fishermen's Pavilion will only have to pay the Washington State Leasehold Tax to use the space during the day.
