CHANGES CONSIDERED FOR ANNUAL MOORAGE RENEWALS

When the new Moorage Model was adopted earlier this year, the Port Commission directed staff to review the marinas' annual moorage policy with regard to the timing of renewals and move everyone toward one renewal date. The current policy allows customers the option to prepay annual moorage any time during the year. After working with the Marina Advisory

Committee on this issue, the MAC unanimously supported the change in policy to move all annual moorage renewals to April 1 of each year beginning April 1, 2013. The Commission will consider this item at its December 5 meeting. If approved, staff will work in 2012 to phase all existing annual moorage accounts for renewal on April 1, 2013.

SQUALICUM HARBOR CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Structural Repairs to Gate 7

Crews are completing the final structural repairs to Gate 7. Upon completion of this project, portions of Gate 9, Gate 10, and all of Gate 7 will have newly installed whaler material, weldments, cleats and thru rods. This targeted structural work is part of a multi-year improvement project to several mooring areas throughout Squalicum's Inner Harbor, with more coming in 2012. Harbor Staff would like to thank you all for your cooperation and flexibility during this project.

Gate 3 F and G Docks Replacement Project

Construction crews have been busy removing the old floats, piling, and utilities on the F and G mooring areas of Gate 3. Dredging is the next phase of the project and is expected to begin around Dec. 7. Dredge crews will work seven days a week for an estimated six weeks until completion, expected to be around the middle of January. As a reminder, boaters may experience slight delays at the entrances to the outer basin due to dredging operations. Please follow proper navigational rules of the road.
