Western Washington University (WWU): Professional Programs, Services, Updates

WWU President Sabah Randhawa and WWU Career Services Center Director Mindy Pelton provided an overview of WWU's current initiatives/projects.

- Creating a branch campus on the peninsulas (population base currently half-million w/no provider). Forecasted to serve 1,200-1,300 students by 2030.
- Focusing on outreach + continuing education. Half-million Washingtonians have work experience w/out a degree; WWU focused on opportunities to provide a credential.
- Completing a strategic visioning exercise for long-term facilities plan + services:
 - Lincoln Creek property in consideration for housing/development
 - o Kaiser Borsari Hall renovation, \$120 mil., expected completion Jan. 2025
 - Student Development Center (welcome center + will house all student-related services)
 - House of Healing, construction began spring 2024
 - WWU increasing childcare capacity from 60 to 90 (continues to have a long waitlist)
- Career + Business Services
 - Industry summit planned for Fall 2024; Key industry sectors to discuss workforce needs
 + partnership opportunities with WWU.

WCBCC Workforce Sub-Committee, Guest Speaker:

Northwest Workforce Council Workforce Programs Manager Scott Iddings provided an overview of workforce program services available to local businesses.
